In celebration of its 70th anniversary, PAL has issued metal vintage model aircrafts and sequentially numbered limited edition timepieces engraved with PAL's first logo on the caseback.

DOUGLAS DC-3

PAL operated with five DC-3s on 14 February 1946. With the DC-3, PAL was able to develop a domestic route system that at one time covered more than 60 points. The airplanes carried more than 10 million passengers before the last was retired in April 1978. Die cast metal. Miniature Douglas DC-3 in 1:400 scale.



AIGNER "ASTI DUE" LADIES WATCH

Swiss made timepiece with a thick steel bezel on the trademark horseshoe shape, engraved with the brand name and dotted at 12-hour with an exquisite diamond, encasing a mother-of-pearl dial with a striking AIGNER "A" logo in the centre.



CONVAIR 340

PAL ordered three CV340s and the first was delivered in April 1953. It was operated to Hong Kong and Bangkok. The airplane went into domestic service in December 1953 when a new airport was opened at Cagayan de Oro City. Only two CV340s were used and the last was retired in 1958. Die cast metal. Miniature Convair 340 in 1:400 scale.



PAL 70TH ANNIVERSARY AVIATOR WATCH

The tips of the sub-dial hands depict the colors of our logo, while "Manila" is displayed together with names of 23 international cities in the world time display system. The years "1941-2011" show the seven decades when PAL soared and built air bridges between communities and nations.
