## VACCINATION REQUIREMENT FOR WORK PASS HOLDERS, STUDENT'S PASS HOLDERS AND THEIR DEPENDANTS

As part of the Singapore Government's plan on the safe reopening of its borders, all Work Pass holders, Student's Pass holders, and their dependants must [complete their COVID-19 vaccinations](#) with [World Health Organisation Emergency Use Listing \(WHO-EUL\) vaccines](#) at least 14 days before entering Singapore.

2 **From 1 February 2022, 0001hrs (Singapore time)**, all air operators of flights to Singapore must ensure that all Work Pass<sup>1</sup> holders, Student's Pass holders, their dependants<sup>2</sup>, and holders of an In-Principle Approval (IPA) letter entering Singapore have one of the following proofs of vaccination before boarding:

- (a) an acceptance letter issued by the Safe Travel Office (STO) confirming that the traveller's vaccination certificate has been verified using the Vaccination Check Portal (see **Annex A** for sample); or
- (b) an electronic or physical copy of a vaccination certificate, which states the following:
  - Traveller's name as stated on the passport;
  - At least 1 other personal identifier (e.g. date of birth or passport number), corresponding exactly with the information in the traveller's passport used for entry into Singapore;
  - Country of vaccination;
  - Name of vaccine(s) administered<sup>3</sup> (if more than 1 dose, the name of each vaccine administered); and
  - Vaccination date(s) (if more than 1 dose, the date each dose was administered). Please ensure that travellers have completed their vaccinations **at least 14 days before** entering Singapore.

- (c) Vaccination status on the HealthHub app or TraceTogether app (see **Annex B** for sample).

3 The following groups of travellers are not required to present a proof of vaccination:

- (a) travellers below 18 years old<sup>4</sup> on their date of arrival;
- (b) travellers who cannot be vaccinated due to medical conditions or special considerations. They will be issued an exemption letter by a Singapore Government Agency and must show this to the airline during pre-boarding checks (see **Annex C and Annex D** for samples); and
- (c) travellers entering Singapore via the Familial Ties Lane (FTL) with the corresponding Approval Letter for Entry (ALE).

4 Airlines must ensure full compliance with the border measures in force, including screening of passengers' recent travel history, the necessary approval letters and vaccination document or exemption letter, where applicable, at the point of departure for all flights to Singapore.

5 Existing Not-To-Land (NTL) policies and procedures will apply for passengers who:

- (a) do not meet Singapore's prevailing entry requirements; or
- (b) are not travelling via an approved transit or transfer route under CAAS Directive No. 11/2020.

6 Information on the additional requirements will be updated on the IATA Timatic service.

7 This Circular takes effect **from 1 February 2022, 0001 hours (Singapore time) and supersedes** CAAS Circular 2021/65 dated 20 October 2021 ("*Vaccination Requirement for Work Pass and Student's Pass Holders*").
